S.C.R.A.P., Inc. Safety Rules

We want a safe show for our exhibitors and public. We believe that by using common sense and following the listed rules, we will have a safe and fun show

- 1. Must be a member of SCRAP to exhibit and/or drive in a parade
- 2. All operators of tractors, other motorized equipment and vehicles:
 - Must be 16 years old and over. (Exception: Jr Tractor Pull on Sunday at White Star Park at the tractor-pulling track)
 - b. Must know how to operate same. We understand operators must have an opportunity to learn, but feel the show hours are not the place for teaching the operations of equipment.
 - c. Must operate in a safe and cautious manner at all times. No horseplay or speeding will be allowed.
 - d. Operate at a maximum speed of 4 mph. (fast walk)
 - e. Will only operate vehicles/equipment at night with lighting adequate for driver and others around him/her to see and be seen (handheld flashlights are not adequate lighting).
- 3. No lawn tractors/mowers can pull any type of trailer on the show grounds.
- 4. Parades: Trailers are permitted however, an adult must be on board the trailer if any passenger is riding. Must be a minimum of six (6) years old to ride. Seats on the trailer must be securely fastened to the trailer.
- 5. Slow Moving Vehicle signs (SMV): All agricultural tractors and farm machinery that are operated off White Star grounds (i.e. parade from fairgrounds to White Star and through Gibsonburg, etc.) that has any affiliation with SCRAP must have a properly mounted SMV sign. (per state law ORC Sec. 4501.01) Must be a licensed driver to be in the parades.

- 6. We recommend only one person per tractor.
 - a. Unless a second person can be safely accommodated and the owner takes full responsibility.
 - b. At no time, will there be any more than two (2) allowed on a tractor.
 - c. Also no riding in the bucket, on a fender, or axles is permitted.
- 7. NO motor bikes, ATV's, electric scooters, or bicycles permitted on show grounds. (DAY OR NIGHT)
- 8. Any SCRAP Officer/Director reserves the right to, in his/her sole discretion, to deny admission to any person or vehicle, or to require any person or vehicle to leave, without refunding admission or registration fees.
- 9. No alcoholic beverages allowed on show grounds.
- 10. Pets allowed only at campsites and must be leashed.

 Owner must clean up after pet.
- 11. Fires to be contained in fire rings or grills (camper to provide). Should weather conditions necessitate, fires may be prohibited during the show. This will be determined and warranted as necessary.
- 12. Fire lanes must be kept OPEN at all times, NO PARKING IN FIRE LANES. This includes drives in camping, flea market, tractor display, around red and gray barns, auction and log cabin areas. This will be strictly enforced.
- 13. Extension cords are not to be run where anyone could trip on them or be driven over.
- 14. Display vehicles loaded with machinery, trucks, or other items during the show must have their load securely fastened
- 15. Engines will not be operated during the show unless the owner or a person designated by the owner is in close attendance.
- 16. No motor vehicles of any kind in the flea market area between 8 am and 5 pm, except electric personal assistive mobility devices.

- 17. Loading/Unloading of any equipment is not recommended after dark. Get a helper and keep all others at a safe distance. If assistance is needed, ask a SCRAP member and/or a director.
- 18. All equipment with steel lugs or spade lugs will not be allowed on any blacktop or other hard surfaces.
- 19. Adjustments should not be made while equipment is moving or operating. If adjustments need to be made while equipment is in operation, use extreme caution. Always have others help you.
- 20. All belted equipment shall be roped off and all sharp protrusions such as sickle bars and forks on loaders must be protected. The operator is responsible for the safety of the equipment and the people are a safe distance away.
- 21. Fuel tanks must be capped. Fuel leaks are grounds for barring entry to the show, or the removal by towing from the show grounds. Clean up of fuel spills will be at the owner's expense. When fueling engines, keep in mind the following:
 - a. Fuel should be kept in approved containers only. NO GLASS!
 - When refueling engine, it must be shut off and preferably cooled off. If unable to shut off and cool off, then use extreme caution and have a standby fire extinguisher and know how to use it
 - c. No smoking or other open fire while refueling.

If you see a situation that needs corrective action taken, do not hesitate to bring it to the attention of an Officer or Director of the club. You may also report any problems to the announcer at the entertainment tent or registration booth (little red barn).

Orphans and Oddball Tractors

This year S.C.R.A.P. is featuring Orphans and Oddball tractors. Most people call these the lesser-known tractors.

The tractor on our shirts this year is called a **Sandusky Tractor** from Sandusky, Ohio. The Sandusky Tractor Company Inc. has a rich history, starting with the establishment of Dauch Manufacturing Co. in 1912. The company's first tractor, the Sandusky Model E, was a 15-35 model, and it remained in production until 1920. The Sandusky Model J, a streamlined tractor, was produced in 1917 and is known for its durability and performance. The Erie County Heritage Society has preserved and restored these tractors, showcasing their significance in agricultural history. The company's legacy continues through the preservation of these historic tractors and the ongoing interest in antique farm equipment. They were in business from 1912 to 1920. We will have a Sandusky Tractor in the feature tent this year for all to enjoy.



There were other tractor manufactered in the early days. this is just a few of the Oprhans and Oddballs that we will highlight in this article.

The Advance-Rumely Company, founded in 1853, was a pioneer in the agricultural machinery industry, known for its threshers and large tractors. The company's origins trace back to the Advance Thresher Company and M. Rumely Company, which merged in 1909 to form Advance-Rumely. The company's most notable product, the Rumely Oil Pull tractors, powered by kerosene, was first developed in 1909 and began selling to the public by 1910. The company was purchased by Allis-Chalmers in 1931, and its legacy as a pioneer in agricultural machinery continues to resonate within the industry.



The Centaur Tractor, officially known as the Le Roi Centaur tractor, has a rich history that began in the mid-20th century. Founded in Greenwich, Ohio, as the Central Ohio Tractor Company, it changed its name to Centaur Tractor Company in 1928. The company was known for its innovative designs, such as the KV (Klear View) tractor, which provided a clear view of the ground beneath the operator. Centaur tractors were known for their simplicity and ease of operation, making them accessible to average farmers. Despite facing challenges such as debt and competition, Centaur Tractors continued to innovate and adapt, becoming an iconic brand in agricultural machinery. The early models were geared towards the smaller operations with a sulky-type design so the farmer could attach implements.



General Ordnance Company - General Ordnance manufactured the Denning-designed tractor under the National Tractor and GO brands. General Ordnance was a munitions manufacturer in Derby, Connecticut. General Ordnance purchased Denning, of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, in 1918 and briefly sold it as National Tractor before using the General Ordnance name. Production stopped in 1921 and the firm declared bankruptcy in 1922. Only a few tractors were built, and only four examples are known to survive today.



Happy Farmer started producing tractors in Minneapolis in 1916. The company was soon reorganized as the La Crosse Tractor Company by merging Happy Farmer and the Sta-Rite Engine Company and continued to build Happy Farmer brand tractors until 1921. Oshkosh Tractor made plans to purchase and move production, but the deal was not finalized and Happy Farmer ceased production.



Huber Tractor - The first Huber tractor, released in 1926, this initial model combined innovative engineering with the ruggedness necessary for farm work, quickly earning a reputation for reliability. As the years rolled on, Huber continued to adapt to the changing landscape of farming machinery. The company introduced several models, including the well-respected Huber "Super 6" in the 1930s, which further solidified Huber's place in the tractor world. With robust features and a commitment to quality, these tractors delivered performance that farmers could trust, cultivated loyalty among their user base, and began to carve out a niche in an increasingly competitive market. Huber tractors were known for their ruggedness, with some models like the Maintainer being used for airfield construction and postwar road building.

David Bradley - In 1873, David Bradley purchased a plow company from his brother-in-law, and soon partnered with Conrad Furst to create Furst and Bradley. Furst and Bradley eventually grew to occupy an entire city block at Fulton and Desplaines Streets in Chicago. In 1884 David Bradley and his sons purchased Furst's share of the business, and the company was renamed the David Bradley Manufacturing Company.

In 1895 the company was relocated to North Kankakee (about 50 miles south of Chicago), which was later renamed Bradley, Illinois in honor of the man and the company. In 1910, the Bradley family sold the factory to Sears, Roebuck and Co., at which time it was renamed the David Bradley Manufacturing Company. The name was subsequently changed to David Bradley Manufacturing Works and in 1958 the company introduced the Garden Riding Tractor and David Bradley became the largest manufacturer of garden riding tractors in the world.



Montgomery Ward's - Custom Manufacturing Company, was known for producing tractors in the early 1950s. These tractors were sold by department stores and were praised for their pulling power and unique features. One notable tractor, the Wards Model C, was built in 1952 and was equipped with a dual exhaust, 6-cylinder industrial engine, and a New Process 5-speed transmission. It weighed about 3,200 lbs and claimed 25 (toolbar) hp, making it capable of pulling a 3-bottom plow. The company's tractors were known for their rarity and the name "Wards" and the company logo front and center on the hood.



Eagle Tractor - The Eagle Manufacturing Company, founded in 1888, began as the Eagle Fork Company and later became known for its tractors. The company's first tractor was a 32-horsepower model in 1906, and it was one of the first to switch to a 6-cylinder engine in 1930. Despite facing challenges during the Great Depression and World War II, the company continued to produce tractors until 1938. The company's history is marked by innovation, resilience, and a commitment to providing reliable agricultural equipment.



Avery Company, founded by Robert Hanneman Avery, was an American farm tractor manufacturer famed for its undermounted engine which resembled a railroad engine more than a conventional farm steam engine. Avery founded the farm implement business after the Civil War. His company built a large line of products, including steam engines, beginning in 1891. The company started with a return flue design and later adapted the undermount style, including a bulldog design on the smokebox door. Their design was well received by farmers in central Illinois. They expanded their market nationwide and overseas until the 1920s, when they failed to innovate and the company faltered.



Fageol Tractor Co. was founded in 1916 in Oakland, California, by Rollie, William, Frank, and Claude Fageol. The company initially focused on manufacturing motor trucks, farm tractors, and automobiles. The first Fageol tractor was a re-labeled Hamilton Walking Tractor, designed and built by Rush E. Hamilton of Geyserville, California. The Fageol tractor was designed by a team led by Horatio Smith, in cooperation with Hamilton. In about 1923, the tractor business was sold to the Great Western Motors Company of San Jose, with Hamilton and Smith joining Great Western.
